Dear President Deby,

I am XXXXXX from Burma, which rule by military government over 60 years. As a citizen from the country, where suspected people are arrested and put under torture ,I am very interest and worry about 25 men who were disappeared after armed opposition movement on N'Djamena.I believe that, fate of these 25 men are worth to be care as a human being. I would like you to fine out where these 25 men are.

In article 9 of universal declaration of human rights no one shall be subjected to arbitrary arrest, detention or exile. Therefore, if they were arrested and still alive, they must be released unless they are to be charged with recognizable criminal offences and brought promptly to trial in accordance with international fair trial standards.

In article 10 of universal declaration of human rights everyone is entitle in full equality to a fair and public hearing by an independent and impartial tribunal. Therefore, their trial might be fair and public hearing. On behalf of their families I would like to request your attention for them. Even if they committed crimes, they have right to protect themselves with international fair trial standards before sentence to prison.

I am writing this letter to you with deepest sympathy for these 25 men and full respect to human rights. I hope you can bring justice for them and protect them with law. I wish you to get more moral respect and lead your country to a better future.
